

# MINUTES OF THE 1<sup>st</sup> MEETING OF THE CONVENTION CENTER AUTHORITY OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE & DAVIDSON COUNTY

The 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on October 14, 2009 at 9:00 a.m., in Room 203 at the Nashville Convention Center (NCC), Nashville, Tennessee.

The meeting was opened for business by Rich Riebeling, Metro Director of Finance, who introduced Mayor Karl Dean. Mayor Dean thanked everyone for their commitment to the city and undertaking this very important project.

Rich Riebeling then noted the Appeal of Decisions.

**ACTION:** Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person of other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

Mr. Riebeling stated that the first order of business based on state law would be the election of officers and asked for nominations for Chairman.

**ACTION:** Leo Waters made a motion to nominate Marty Dickens as Chairman. The motion was seconded by Willie McDonald. With no other nominations or discussion, by acclamation the nomination was approved by the authority.

Chairman Marty Dickens then asked for nominations for Vice-Chair. Darrell Drumwright was nominated, but declined.

**ACTION:** Leo Waters made a motion to nominate Vonda McDaniel as Vice-Chair. The motion was seconded by Luke Simons. With no other nominations or discussion, by acclamation the nomination was approved by the authority.

There was discussion regarding the position(s) of Secretary and Treasurer being separate or combined. Chairman Dickens then asked for nominations for Secretary/Treasurer.

**ACTION:** Luke Simons made a motion to nominate Mona Lisa Warren as Secretary/Treasurer. The motion was seconded by Leo Waters. With no other nominations or discussion, by acclamation the nomination was approved by the authority.

At this time Charles Starks, Executive Director of the Nashville Convention Center was introduced. (Attachment #1) Mr. Starks shared information about the current convention center and the differences between the old and proposed center. He also reported on the interest of clients in a new center and work that has already been done.

Next, Larry Atema, Project Manager, was introduced. (Attachment #1) Mr. Atema shared information about the cost, project development, and plans for Korean Veterans Boulevard.

Rich Riebeling then shared information about the hotel development team, location, scope, sources of funding, and financing notes. (Attachment #1)

The Authority discussed topics for future meetings and a proposed meeting schedule through the end of the calendar year.

With no additional business Leo Waters made a motion to adjourn, with no objection the CCA adjourned at 10:50 a.m.

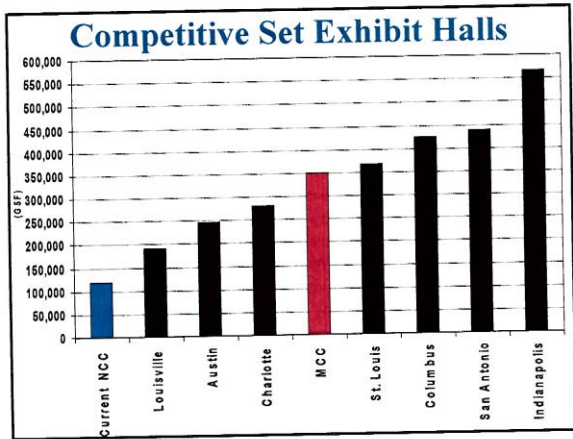

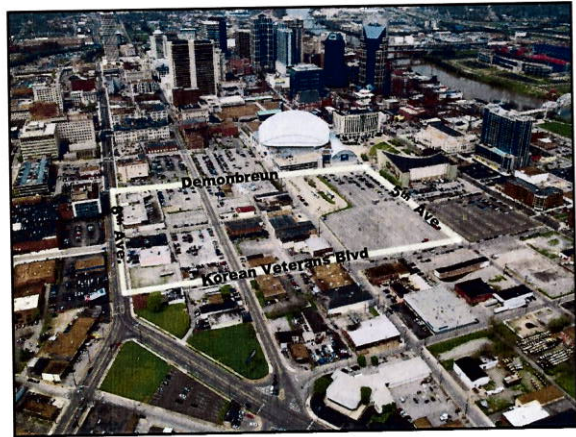

- Preliminary Construction Estimate Ongoing

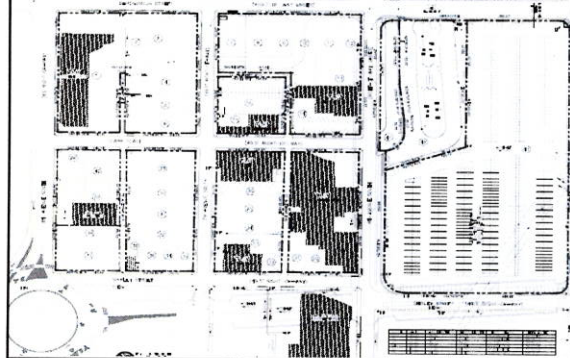

- Bike Path

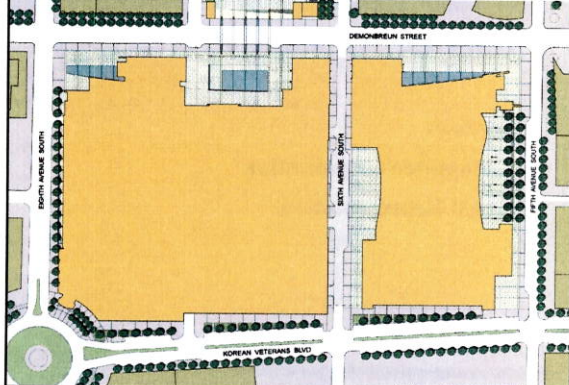


## Korean Veterans Boulevard – Location/Funding

## Korean Veterans Boulevard - Late 2012

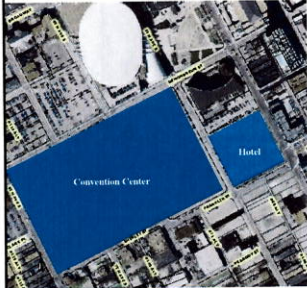

## Sources of Funding/Repayment of Debt

- 3 cents of current 6 cent Hotel/Motel Tax
- \$2 Convention Center Fee (per room/per night county-wide)
- Car Rental Tax at 1%
- Airport Ground Transportation Departure Fee of \$2
- Future Tourism Development Zone
- Re-direction of State Sales Tax Revenues Generated within Music City Center Campus
- Municipal Bonds



## Financing Notes

- Current Convention Center – No Debt
- No General Fund Money (i.e., property tax) has been or will be used for debt, capital, or operations
- Metro Council Vote Needed to Authorize Bonds
- Sale of Bonds Targeted for February 2010
- Multiple Financial Consultants Reviewing Plans
